Executive Summary				
<p>The aim of the COVID-19 vaccination programme is to protect those who are most at risk of serious illness or death should they develop COVID-19, and reduce transmission of the infection, thereby contributing to the protection of vulnerable individuals who may have a suboptimal response to their own immunisation.</p> <p>The supportive slides provide an overview of the contributions to date the Trust has made in supporting the Nottinghamshire vaccination programme. The slides also provide an overview of colleague vaccination at Sherwood Forest Hospitals.</p> <p>The Summary highlights are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Total number of vaccinations issues in the Hospital Hub since 8th December 2020 are 56,199. • Total number of all colleagues (excluding our bank force) vaccinated 4,700 (87%) and number outstanding is 698. • Number of BME colleagues vaccinated stands at 544 (82%) and number 				

outstanding 123.

- Total number of front line colleagues vaccinated 4,919 (82%) and number outstanding 1,098.
- Number of colleagues onboarded to support the vaccination programme across 9 different site locations is 3,808.
