<b>Executive Summary</b>				
<p>The aim of the COVID-19 vaccination programme is to protect those who are at risk of serious illness or death should they develop COVID-19, and reduce transmission of the infection, thereby contributing to the protection of population health.</p> <p>The paper provides an overview of the contributions the Trust has made to support the Nottingham and Nottinghamshire COVID-19 vaccination programme.</p> <p>The details of the vaccinations issued to date are summarised in the attached slides.</p> <p>The Summary highlights to date are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Kings Mill Covid Vaccination Hub has exceeded 200,000 vaccines.</li> <li>• Completed onboarding for Overseas Vaccination Validation Service and appointments available from 22.02.2022.</li> <li>• Continue to progress workforce model to support the Programme in 2022.</li> <li>• Identification of eligible 5-11 year olds via Hospital Consultants and E-Healthscope.</li> <li>• KMH Hub Hours adjusted Monday- Friday 8am-6pm, Saturday and Sunday 8am-2pm. Core staff model in place.</li> </ul>				

- Targeted inpatient vaccination roving service continues to deliver vaccine weekly.
- Capacity published on NBS for preceding 6 weeks.

In the month the Trust was unable to access the National Immunisation Management System (NIMS) and therefore not able to provide an updated position on the Trusts uptake on colleagues from across the Trust being vaccinated. However, the most recent report identifies 96% of the workforce have received 2 vaccines.

The update also provides an overview of the approach for the requirements COVID-19 vaccination as a condition of deployment for all healthcare workers, noting governments announcement to revoke the legislation and how through a dedicated working group this is progressing.

#### Recommendation

The Trust Board is asked to take assurance from the report and to note the significant contributions made by colleagues at Sherwood Forest to enable the successful delivery of vaccinations to the citizens of Nottinghamshire and colleagues working at Sherwood.
