How to use a metered dose inhaler

This leaflet will inform you how to use a metered dose inhaler (MDI)

Always read the patient information leaflet which comes with this inhaled medication.



This is a metered dose inhaler. These come in different colours indicating different medicines.

If your inhaler contains a steroid medication, remember to rinse your mouth afterwards to prevent soreness.

The benefit of using your inhaler correctly is that your asthma or chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) will be controlled more effectively.

Incorrect use of your inhaler may result in reduced control.

To effectively use your metered dose inhaler follow this step-by-step guide:

1. Use only as prescribed.
2. Shake the inhaler.
3. Remove the cap.
4. Breathe out gently.
5. Put the mouthpiece in the mouth.
6. Start to breathe in slowly, then press the canister down and continue to breathe in steadily.
7. Hold the breath for ten seconds, or as long as possible, and then breathe out slowly.
8. Wait for a few seconds before repeating steps 2-7.
9. Replace cap.

How to clean the metered-dose inhaler

This is a CFC-free canister holder. The spray outlet hole can block easily so please check the manufacturer's instructions to see whether your metered dose inhalers canister can be washed.

How to store the metered dose inhalers:

- Store in a safe place away from young children.
- Store away from extremes of temperature.

- Do not freeze.

Replacement of metered dose inhalers:

- Not all MDIs have the same number of doses.
- Always check the expiry date on the canister.
- Do not use after the expiry date.
- Do not puncture, break or burn the canister even when empty.
- Most MDIs do not have a dose counter; this makes it difficult to tell when it is empty. One way of checking that the device is becoming empty is when you shake the inhaler at the beginning; you will start to notice it feeling lighter as the fluid level inside drops.
- The Salmeterol/Fluticasone combination (Seretide) has a dose counter. This counts down from 120 doses.
