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## Local anaesthetic cataract patients

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### On the day of surgery:

- Wear loose fitting clothing
- Bring a list of your medications or your medication themselves
- Eat and drink as normal
- Ensure you have transport home and support overnight
- Ensure you have the means to instill your eye drops
- Expect to be on the unit for up to six hours.

### Main points following surgery:

- Always wash your hands before putting in your eye drops
- No driving for two weeks
- No bending or heavy lifting for two weeks
- Bath or shower from the neck down
- Wear a shield at night for two weeks (you will need some surgical tape).
