About the Stroke Unit

The Stroke Unit (wards 53/54) cares for patients who have had an acute stroke and provides rehabilitation following initial treatment.

We provide a thrombolysis service (which uses a clot busting drug) 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, which we use to treat a stroke caused by a blood clot. This treatment is only given to suitable patients within 4½ hours of the stroke occurring.

We also refer patients to Queen's Medical Centre at Nottingham between Monday and Friday, 8am-6pm, and weekends 8am – 12pm for mechanical thrombectomy (clot retrieval) which is a procedure where a 'guide wire' is used to remove the clot causing the stroke. This is used in conjunction with thrombolysis and only given to suitable patients.

We run a high-risk TIA (transient ischaemic attack – also known as a mini stroke) clinic on the unit. This is for patients whose stroke symptoms have resolved but are at a high risk of having another stroke.

Patients are seen at King's Mill Hospital between Monday and Friday and at Nottingham University Hospitals on Saturdays and Sundays. Appropriate investigations and results are all done the same day.

Alongside the Stroke Unit we have the Integrated Community Stroke Service (ICSS) who provide rehabilitation for patients in their own homes for up to six months. Patients will need to be assessed as being suitable for this service.

We have a ward-based gym and activities room to help suitable patients back on their road to recovery.
