

INFORMATION FOR PATIENTS

Catheter care after discharge

You are being discharged home with a catheter in place.

The Urology Outreach Nurses will be in touch with you in due course to arrange for the catheter to be removed. We aim to remove your it within two weeks.

Before you leave the hospital, please ensure you have been given spare leg/night bags and have been shown how to apply and change these. We recommend you change them weekly.

Personal hygiene is very important. Have a daily shower or bath. Do this with your leg bag or valve attached. Wash the skin in the area where the catheter enters the body with unperfumed or mild soap and water at least daily.

Your catheter should not cause you any problems, but occasionally it may leak. One reason for this is constipation, so please ensure your bowel movements are regular. As long as it is draining, and you are not experiencing any pain, please do not be alarmed.
