

INFORMATION FOR PATIENTS

Local anaesthetic cataract patients

On the day of surgery:

- Wear loose fitting clothing.
- Bring a list of your medications or your medication themselves.
- Eat and drink as normal.
- Ensure you have transport home and support overnight.
- Ensure you have the means to instill your eye drops.
- Expect to be on the unit for up to six hours.
- You do not need your dressing gown or slippers.
- Only females under 56 need a sample of urine.

Main points following surgery:

- Always wash your hands before putting in your eye drops.
- No driving for two weeks.
- No bending or heavy lifting for two weeks.
- Bathe or shower from the neck down.
- Wear a shield at night for two weeks (you will need some surgical tape).
