Paediatric overnight home oximetry sleep study

Your child's doctor has requested that we perform an overnight home sleep study.

This diagnostic test is usually performed to monitor your child's oxygen levels overnight.

Test instructions

An overnight oximetry study involves collecting equipment from the hospital to take home and fit to your child at home, for them to wear overnight while they are asleep.

The test is very simple and will involve connecting a small probe to your child's finger or toe. Once connected, the machine will need to be turned on and left running throughout the night. In the morning, turn off the machine and detach the sensor from your child and return the equipment to the hospital.

Parents, guardians, or carers can collect and return the device from the hospital.



Full instructions are provided with the equipment along with questionnaires, which need to be completed and returned with the equipment.

The device may alarm during the night if the probe has become disconnected, but it can be silenced.

Results

A consultant will look at your child's sleep study report and will write directly to you with the results. Any further tests or treatments required will be arranged as necessary.

Please note that you will not be given the results on the day of your test.
